Boo-Hooray Shortlist #54 Raymond Pettibon Black Flag Flyers

Boo-Hooray is pleased to present our latest shortlist, gathering nearly three dozen hand-drawn Black Flag concert flyers by selftaught artist and frequent Black Flag collaborator Raymond Pettibon (b. 1957).

American punk band Black Flag is known for their raw, anguished sound, and for being one of the first hardcore punk bands. Their logo is iconic: a series of four vertical, black bars meant to represent an abstracted flag blowing in the wind designed by Raymond Pettibon, the brother of Black Flag founder and guitarist Greg Ginn. Throughout the late-1970s and 80s Pettibon created hundreds of flyers for Black Flag that shaped the band's visual identity while defining a DIY punk aesthetic characterized by bleak humor and a critique of Reagan-era politics and consumer culture.

Pettibon's unapologetically transgressive illustrations draw inspiration from the world of comics, smut, and pop culture, and feature a gruesome cast of characters from low lifes, drug users, sexualized nuns and devils, babies, nude women, and businessmen weilding guns, needles, knives, and razor blades. Taken together, the Black Flag flyers in this shortlist capture the discontent and subversive ethos of the US hardcore scene.

For over a decade, Boo-Hooray has been committed to the organization, stabilization, and preservation of cultural narratives through archival placement. Today, we continue and expand our mission through the sale of individual items and smaller collections.



This flyer includes a reproduction of the album's cover art illustrated by Raymond Pettibon, which depicts a hand puppet holding a kitchen knife, though many have interpreted this image as Adolf Hitler being punched in the face by a boxing glove.



3. Black Flag with the Misfits and Vandals at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium (Everything Went Black Reunion)

Flyer for Black Flag's Everything Went Black Reunion on June 11, 1983 at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium. The performance featured former band members including Ron Reyes, Dez Cadena, Robo, Keith Morris (credited as Johnny Bob Goldstein), and Chuck Dukowski. The Misfits and the Vandals also performed.

Everything Went Black was a double LP issued by SST Records in 1982 that included a compilation of previously unreleased early Black Flag recordings and outtakes produced before Henry Rollins joined as the band's vocalist in 1981. At the time, Black Flag was involved in a lawsuit with Unicorn Records and were prohibited from putting out new music under their own name. Releasing this archival material, the band believed, was not in violation of the injunction, although Unicorn disagreed. The dispute would finally be resolved in 1983 when the record label went out of business, and Black Flag was able to release new music again.




4. Black Flag at Clutch Cargo's

Flyer for two Black Flag shows at Clutch Cargo's in Detroit on June 17, 1982 as part of the first leg of the band's 1982 U.S. Tour. The flyer features a photo of the band with Henry Rollins in the foreground.

Rollins joined Black Flag in 1981, bringing an intensely visceral physicality to their performance. He would go on to be the band's longest-lasting vocalist.



Flyer for Black Flag opening for the Ramones with the Minutemen on November 17, 1984 at the Hollywood Palladium (erroneously spelled "Paladium" on the flyer) as part of Black Flag's 1984 'Slip It In' tour.

This concert was immortalized in an iconic photograph by Los Angeles photographer Gary Leonard depicting a squad of LAPD riot cops marching into the venue. The marquee above them reads "KROQ and Avalon Attractions Bring You The Ramones Black Flag Nov 17 8 PM." The photo was later used on the cover of Henry Rollins's 1994 memoir, *Get in the Van*.

A rare remnant of one of Black Flag's most famous live performances.

Black Flag shared the bill with Middle Class and Social Distortion on the first night and Adolescents and China White on second.



The flyer features a drawing of a nude man saying, "Do you know what's TRULY obscene? That trees were cut down so that Pettibon could print this."






























